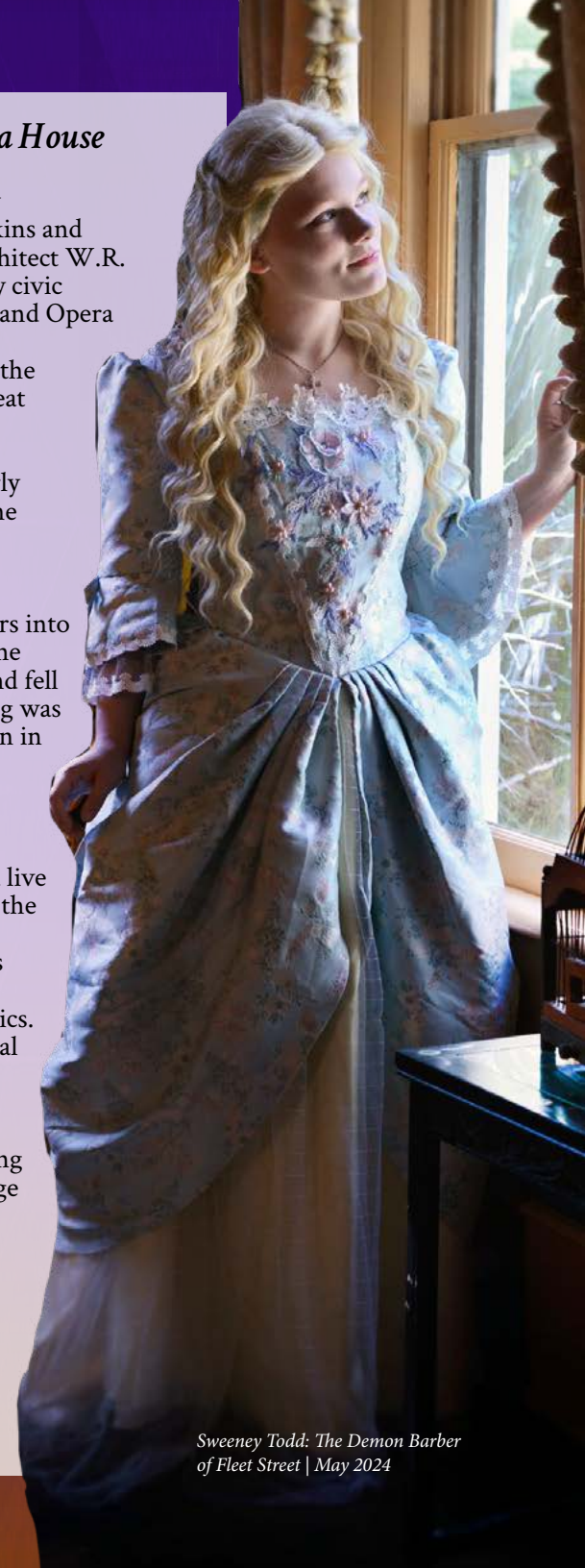

HISTORY of the Opera House

- MOH was built in 1890 by entrepreneur John H. Perkins and designed by renowned architect W.R. Gunn, who designed many civic buildings including the Grand Opera House in Macon, GA.
- It featured retail stores on the ground floor and a 300+ seat theater upstairs.
- The theater held live performances until the early 1900's when a change in the rail system reduced travel to Monticello and theater attendance declined.
- Retail continued downstairs into the late 20th century but the theater remained closed and fell into disrepair. The building was finally slated for demolition in 1972.
- Concerned citizens started a movement to save the building. Initial restoration efforts enabled live performances to return in the early 1980's.
- The theater is noted for its curved wall design which creates near perfect acoustics. The chandeliers are original and were converted to electricity from gas. The balcony seating is also original. The balcony railing is too low to allow for usage by the general public.

There is much more to know!
Tours of Monticello Opera House are available, and will give you a more complete version of the fascinating history of this institution.

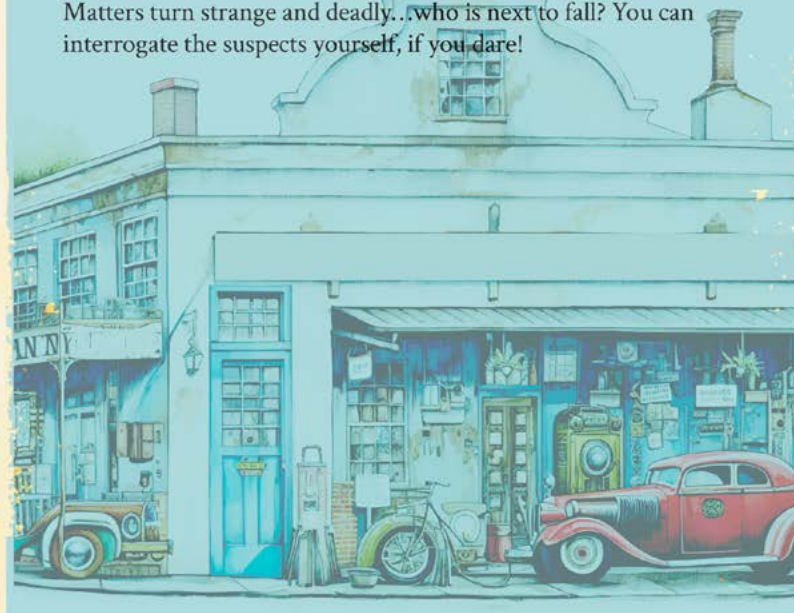

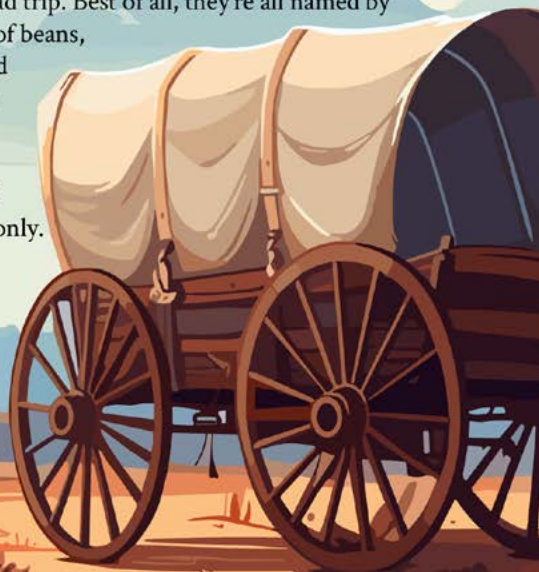

In October 1998, twenty-one-year-old Matthew Shepard, a student at the University of Wyoming, was kidnapped, severely beaten, and left tied to a fence in the middle of the prairie outside Laramie, Wyoming. Moisés Kaufman and fellow members of the Tectonic Theater Project made six trips to Laramie, and over the course of a year and a half they conducted more than 200 interviews with the people of the town. Some people interviewed were directly connected to the case, while others were citizens of Laramie, and the breadth of the reactions to the crime is fascinating. The Laramie Project is a breathtaking collage that explores the depths to which humanity can sink and the heights of compassion of which we are capable.

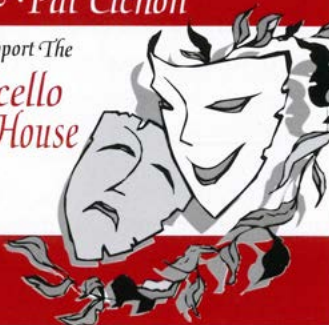

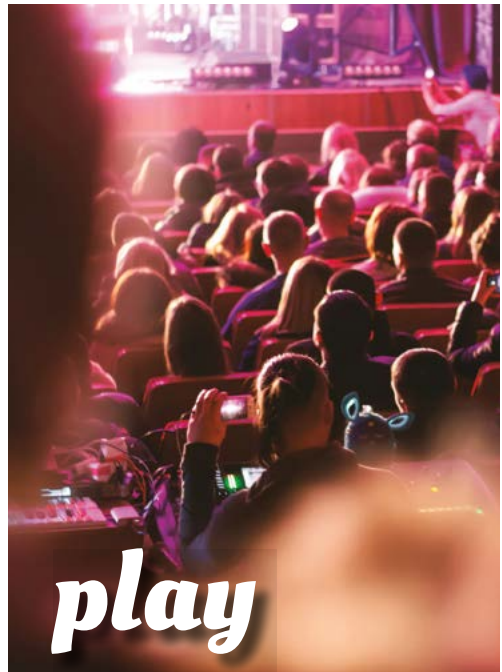
